Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of quarter and year to date standalone financial results of GLOBE CIVIL PROJECTS LIMITED (formerly GLOBE CIVIL PROJECTS PRIVATE LIMITED) (the "Company") for the quarter ended 31st March, 2025 and for the year ended 31st March, 2025 ("Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- is presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations in this regard;

- II. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the quarter and for the year ended 31st March, 2025.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results" section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Management's Responsibilities for the Standalone Financial Results

The Statement has been prepared on the basis of the standalone financial statements. The Management and Board of Directors of the Company are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Statement that gives a true and fair view of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the company in accordance with the applicable accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Statement, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

- c) Results for the quarter ended 31st March, 2024 & year ended 31st March, 2024 are based on the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31st March 2024, were audited by another auditor who expressed an unmodified opinion on those statements vide Independent Auditor's Report dated 2nd September, 2024.

- 1) The above standalone financial results have been approved by the Audit Committee at their meeting held on Monday, the 21st July, 2025 and thereafter approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on Monday, the 21st July, 2025.
- 2) The Statutory Auditors have carried out Audit of the standalone financial results of the company for the quarter and year ended on 31st March, 2025 under Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015. The Statutory Auditors have expressed an unmodified report of the above results.
- 3) This statement has been prepared in accordance with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standard) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.
- 4) The Company is engaged in the business of "Engineering, Procurement & Construction (EPC)", and "Trading of Goods" and these are the only reportable segment in accordance with Ind AS 108 Operating Segments.
- 5) The Company had, for the purpose of Initial Public Offer and preparation of DRHP/RHP/Prospectus, prepared restated standalone financial statements under Ind AS for the financial years ended 31st March 2022, 31st March 2023, and 31st March 2024, which were approved by the Board of Directors. However, the statutory standalone financial statements adopted by the shareholders up to 31st March 2024 were prepared in accordance with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (referred to as "Previous GAAP").

Accordingly, the standalone financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2025 are the Company's first statutory financial statements prepared in compliance with Ind AS.

- 6) On 20.07.2024 the Company issued bonus equity shares of 16 equity shares for every 1 equity shares held out of its securities premium account and Reserves and surplus created out of profit resulting in increase in equity shares by 4,04,31,472 equity shares having face value of ₹ 404.31 Millions. As per para 26 and Ind AS on Earning per Share (Ind AS-33), Per Share calculation for all the period/year presented above are based on new number of equity shares
- 7) Subsequent to the year ended 31st March, 2025, the company has completed its IPO of 1,67,60,560 equity shares of face value of Rs 10/- each at an issue price of 71/- per share (including a share premium of 61/- per share) and as a result the equity





shares of the company were listed on National Stock Exchange of India Limited (NSE) and BSE Limited (BSE) on 1st July, 2025. The issue comprised of a fresh issue of 1,67,60,560 equity shares aggregating to Rs. 1190 million.

- 8) The figures of the last quarter are balancing figures in respect of standalone financial results between audited figures of the financial year ended on March 31, 2025 and the audited year to date figures upto the end of nine months for the current financial year.
- 9) The company's equity shares have been listed on 01st July, 2025 and company was not required to prepare comparative financials for quarter ended 31st December, 2024 and quarter ended 31st March, 2024, hence, previous period comparatives are not available.
- 10) Previous year/ periods figures have been regrouped / reclassified, wherever necessary.
